





Personalised attention and learning

Inquiry-based learning

We implement a transdisciplinary approach by using Units of Inquiry (UOI), integrating multiple subject areas and encouraging students to make connections.

With the UOI at its core, Language, Mathematics, Social Studies, and Science standards are addressed in authentic and meaningful contexts. The programme is further extended through Chinese language (Mandarin), Physical Education, Visual Arts, Music, Drama and Dance to provide young children with meaningful learning experiences and holistic development.

Stimulating and safe learning environment

Our Early Years building is designed with younger children in mind, offering facilities and resources that support their emotional growth and academic progress. We also provide opportunities for our young learners to familiarise themselves with the broader school setting at their own pace. Personalised attention


In the Primary Years, our students receive dedicated support from a homeroom



That's why our curriculum is designed to be broad and balanced to widen students' knowledge, understanding and experiences. It promotes academic rigour, develops intellectual curiosity and fosters the ability to learn independently. It also ensures that academic excellence flourishes alongside arts, music and sport.

In the first five years of Secondary School (Grades 6-10), students follow the IB Middle Years Programme (MYP). The MYP is designed to build upon the knowledge, skills and attitudes developed in the Primary Years and prepare students to meet the academic challenges of the rigorous IB Diploma Programme (DP).



The MYP Programme encourages interdisciplinary study, which enables students to establish meaningful connections between academic subjects.



Through integrated teaching and learning, students gain the ability to analyse complex issues and develop the cognitive skills necessary to engage in our interconnected world actively. This approach fosters a holistic

understanding of topics by transcending disciplinary boundaries and promotes a comprehensive perspective that prepares students to navigate the challenges of our global society.

Concept and content-driven curriculum

Concepts serve as significant ideas that hold relevance within specific disciplines and extend across various subject areas. In the MYP, students utilise concepts to explore issues and ideas of personal, local and global significance. By examining knowledge holistically and reflecting upon it within the relevant context, students develop a comprehensive understanding of the world.

With a strong emphasis on inquiry-based learning, our school prepares students to become creative problem-solvers and cultivates their ability to think independently throughout their lives.

Personal Project

The Personal Project is a vital part of the MYP, required for students in their final year. It offers a valuable chance to explore a personal interest, develop Approaches to Learning (ATL) skills, and showcase creativity. Students freely choose a subject they are passionate about, conducting thorough research, developing critical thinking, and utilising their ATL skills. The project's outcome is a unique creation that reflects their understanding, creativity and personal growth.

Continuous assessment

The IB provides a rigorous framework for assessment and student work is evaluated according to criteria that clearly reflect the holistic philosophy of the programme. Self and peer assessment are integral parts of the process.

In Grade 10, students embark on the MYP eAssessment, a series of future-focused examinations and portfolio submissions that are externally assessed.

These assessments serve as a platform to challenge students to apply their knowledge and skills in problem-solving contexts. Students who successfully complete all subject exams and portfolio submissions can earn an IB MYP Certificate.





Preparing your child for success beyond school

The final two years of Secondary Years are an exciting period for students as they gear up for the next chapter of their educational journey. At XWA, we acknowledge and celebrate each student's individuality, understanding that their aspirations and goals may vary. With this in mind, we provide a range of graduation pathways to cater to their diverse needs and interests. We aim to ensure that every student has the opportunity to pursue a pathway that aligns with their aspirations, enabling them to thrive and succeed in their chosen endeavours.





The DP offers a unique blend of breadth and depth in academic studies, with Standard Level subjects providing a wide-ranging understanding and Higher Level subjects delving into topics with academic rigour. This flexibility allows for a personalised approach, enabling students to create a subject combination that suits their interests and aspirations.

Our comprehensive curriculum goes beyond academics, fostering independent research, honing essay writing skills, nurturing critical thinking, fostering persuasive argumentation, and building confident public speaking abilities. This skill set equips students with the tools they need to excel academically and succeed in their future pursuits, both in higher education and beyond.

IB Diploma Programme

The IB Diploma Programme (DP) is an academically rigorous 2-year pre-university curriculum. It is a highly regarded qualification with final external examinations preparing students aged 16 to 19 for success at university and life beyond university. The programme has gained recognition and respect from the world's leading universities.

DP subject groups

To meet the requirements of the DP and XWA graduation, students have the opportunity to select courses¹ from various subject groups. DP students must choose one course from each of the five subject groups (Group 1-5). Additionally, students are required to select either an art course from The Arts group (Group 6) or a second course from Group 3 or 4². This allows students to explore their interests further and develop a well-rounded academic profile.

DP Core

The DP Core encourages students to self-reflect on the nature of knowledge, pursue independent research, and participate in projects that frequently include community service. It consists of three essential components: Theory of Knowledge (TOK), Extended Essay (EE), and Creativity, Activity, and Service (CAS). These components are mandatory for students seeking to attain the complete IB Diploma.

All students who meet the graduation requirements will also receive the XWA High School Diploma, accredited by the Western Association of Schools and Colleges (WASC).

High School Diploma

Upon fulfilling the graduation requirements, students will be awarded an XWA High School Diploma, accredited by the Western Association of Schools and Colleges (WASC).

XWA High School Diploma students enjoy a higher degree of flexibility in choosing their courses. They have the option to select a different number of subjects and even opt for fewer subjects at a higher level than the three mandated by the DP. This flexibility allows students to tailor their course selection to their interests and academic goals.

Furthermore, High School Diploma students have the opportunity to pursue specialised areas of study that align with their particular areas of interest. This allows them to delve deeper into specific subjects and develop expertise in those areas.

At XWA, our language offerings are designed to meet the needs of our diverse school community. Our Language programme focuses on four key components:


English language for academics

Starting from the Early and Primary Years, our language programmes are designed to foster the development of robust reading, comprehension, and writing skills in your

child. As students progress into the Secondary Years, our Language and Literature classes concentrate on further refining their formal English language skills. These classes aim to enhance critical thinking abilities, enabling students to effectively explore and analyse a wide range of text types. Through these classes, students will gain the necessary tools to engage with complex texts, think critically, and express their ideas confidently in written and spoken English.

Language Acquisition programme

Learning languages is a core component of being an international student. Nursery and Early Years pupils will engage in Mandarin lessons on a daily basis. These young learners will familiarise themselves with basic Mandarin character strokes and immerse themselves in a dynamic and enjoyable learning atmosphere. As they progress to Grade 1 and beyond, students can opt to continue their Mandarin studies or select either Spanish or French as their language of choice. In addition to the above languages, Diploma Programme students have the opportunity to undertake Language A Japanese/Chinese/English Language & Literature OR School Supported Self-Taught Language A Literature in Grades 11-12.



English-Chinese (Mandarin) Bilingual programme³

Our unique English-Chinese (Mandarin) Bilingual programme allows native and non-native Chinese speakers to have a rigorous introduction to Chinese during their formative years.

English as an Additional Language programme

To cater to students whose first language is not English, we provide a rigorous English as an Additional Language (EAL) programme that is robust, comprehensive and personalised. Using the WIDA Framework for Standards, along with Sheltered Instruction strategies (SIOP), and assessment insights, we aim to ensure that all children acquire the essential English language skills required to fully access the curriculum and available programmes.

Home Language programme⁴

The Home Language programme aims to support our students in preserving and advancing their linguistic abilities while providing them with an opportunity to stay connected with their culture and heritage. We offer Home Language programme for students from Pre-K to Grade 5, using two approaches:

- After-school programme (Japanese, Korean, Chinese, French and Spanish);
- Within the school day programme (Japanese).

EARLY & PRIMARY YEARS BILINGUAL PROGRAMME

Equity for multilingual learners

Ensuring that all students, regardless of their language background, have equal access to high quality education.

Teach language and content together

Integrating language instruction with subject matter content allows students to learn both simultaneously.

A functional approach to language

Focusing on the language skills that are most relevant and useful to students, rather than simply teaching grammar and vocabulary in isolation.

Collaboration among stakeholders

Educators, administrators, families and community members work together to support the success of multilingual learners.

Our English - Chinese (Mandarin) Bilingual programme⁵ aims to provide a comprehensive introduction to Chinese (Mandarin) for both native and non-native speakers during their foundational years. It focuses on developing skills in speaking, reading, writing, listening, and communicating in both English

and Chinese, while also adapting to the individual needs and readiness of each student. Unlike other bilingual programmes that use both languages in isolation, our programme is based on the translanguaging model. It ensures that students have integrated learning experiences in both languages.

The foundation of the programme

The curriculum of our bilingual programme aligns with the IB PYP framework, which is followed by all XWA Early and Primary Years students. This ensures that students receive a high-quality education that meets international standards while promoting bilingual proficiency.

Personalised attention to every student

In our Pre-K to Grade 1 classes, bilingual homeroom teachers and teaching partners work together to deliver instruction in both English and Chinese, creating an effective learning environment for our young students. Establishing profound and meaningful connections

with our students is paramount to us, as we place significant emphasis on personal, social, and emotional development. That is why we create a caring and nurturing learning environment where our students feel at ease and familiar with the adults around them, fostering a sense of trust and confidence.

Since August 2023, our Grade 2 students have benefited from enhanced instruction provided by two homeroom teachers—a native English language teacher and a native Chinese language teacher—accompanied by a teaching partner. This initiative aims to bolster pronunciation and fluency in both languages.

At XWA, we believe that an inclusive language programme is essential to the success of all learners. As an IB continuum school, we highly appreciate the multitude of home languages within our student body, the continual growth of the English language and the invaluable opportunity it presents for our students to acquire new languages.

Our Home Language programme is designed to provide comprehensive support to our students in maintaining and enhancing their linguistic abilities while fostering a deep connection with their cultural roots and heritage. We offer Home Language courses through two distinct approaches:

After-school programme

XWA provides an after-school Home Language programme for students in KG2 through Grade 5, offering Japanese, Chinese, French, and Spanish classes. While each class follows a structured curriculum, it is essential to note that the programme is not intended to align with or prepare students for national education system qualifications.

To ensure effective instruction, Home Language students are grouped based on their capabilities and/or age, and they are assigned to 1-hour classes from 3:45 pm to 4:45 pm.

These classes are considered formal lessons, even though they coincide with extracurricular activities. Students who join the programme⁶ are required to commit for the entire academic year. Their attendance will be recorded and report cards will be issued to track their progress.

Within the school day programme

XWA students have the option to incorporate their home languages⁷ into their regular school day timetable, with dedicated lessons scheduled twice a week. As part of this arrangement, students may replace two other curriculum homeroom lessons and/or a lunch break, with the specifics to be determined by the teaching team.

ENGLISH AS AN ADDITIONAL LANGUAGE

Open to a culturally diverse community of learners

The student body at XWA is incredibly diverse, representing approximately 50 nationalities. Many of our students come from linguistically rich backgrounds, requiring personalised support to excel within our English-based curriculum.

To meet this need, we have developed the English as an Additional Language (EAL) programme for students in Grades 1-9. This programme is designed to assist students with limited English language skills to improve their written and spoken English abilities and maximise their educational experience.

At the core of our programme lies the internationally acclaimed WIDA Framework for English Language Development Standards, a renowned research-based framework.

Our curriculum is centred around the students, responsive to their needs, and adaptable to their varying language development levels. Students enrolled in the Mainstream EAL programme will have dedicated lessons focused on English language acquisition instead of their other language acquisition classes, such as French, Chinese (Mandarin), or Spanish.

Our Primary and Secondary Years
Mainstream EAL programmes offer
targeted instruction in grammar,
vocabulary, and overall academic
language development across all
essential skills, including listening,
speaking, writing, and reading. Students
benefit from focused and personalised
English language instruction in a small
group setting during the EAL classes

(outside their regular classrooms). We strive to create a supportive and safe learning environment where EAL teachers encourage active participation in speaking exercises, provide clarifications, and offer guidance tailored to each student's needs.

In addition, EAL students are provided with in-class support. The EAL teachers work closely with the homeroom teacher and teaching partners to ensure comprehensive support for every student. This inclusive approach guarantees students fully integrate into the core curriculum and maintain strong connections with peers. It supports language development, nurtures social communication skills, and promotes inclusivity in all aspects of school life.

In addition to the Mainstream EAL Programme, we offer a Grade 5 Programme with Extensive EAL and a Foundational English Programme designed for students in Grades 6-9. Reach out to our Admissions Team to explore these offerings further.














TRANSPORTATION SERVICES

Easy access from any part of Singapore

XWA is conveniently situated just a 20-minute drive from Singapore City Centre, making it easily accessible by car, public transport, and MRT. To ensure the convenience and safety of our students, we offer a comprehensive door-to-door island-wide bus service. This service is available to all students, including our youngest learners in Nursery. The average journey time for the majority of

riders is estimated to be 45-60 minutes. We prioritise the well-being of students and are equipped with safety belts for all seats. Moreover, bus attendants are on board to provide additional supervision and support.

To further facilitate transportation, we provide a complimentary shuttle bus service to school in the morning,



and back to Yishun MRT in the afternoon after school. This service is available to students, ensuring a convenient and hassle-free commute.

A shuttle bus service to different locations around Singapore is offered to students participating in extracurricular activities at an additional cost.

Additionally, several public bus stops are conveniently located outside the school premises, serviced by bus numbers 103, 117, and 806.

OUR ADMISSIONS PROCESS

1. Apply Online

Submit an online application and upload all required documents⁸.

2. Application Fee

Pay the Application Fee (non-refundable) to initiate the application review process.

3. Application Review

Submitted applications will be reviewed by the Enrolment Team and Educational Leadership Team. Students may be invited to undertake an English Language proficiency assessment (WIDA) and Cognitive Abilities Assessment (CAT4). Students applying for Grade 6 and above may be requested to attend a family meeting with a member of our Senior Leadership Team. Our Admissions Team will take care of all arrangements.

4. Offer

Successful applicants will receive an official Offer Letter from the school's Admissions Department. As part of the application process, you will be required to pay an upfront, non-refundable Enrolment Fee upon receiving the offer letter. After that, you will receive a Student Contract for your review and acceptance and an invoice for the tuition fees.

5. Enrolment

Once all documentation⁹ is submitted and fees paid, your family is all set to start your learning journey with us. You will receive a Welcome Information Pack and be all set to Shape Next Now!
